The *Kronprinzenpalais* is situated in the very heart of Berlin on the main boulevard Unter den Linden, close to some of Berlin's main museums such as the German Historical Museum, the Pergamon Museum and the National Gallery.

The *Kronprinzenpalais* was built in 1663 for the Prussian rulers. It has been used as an exhibition space since 1919. Heavily destroyed in World War II, it was then rebuilt and used to accommodate guests of state of the German Democratic Republic. After the reunification of Germany, it housed temporary exhibitions, including some by the German Historical Museum.

The exhibition "Forced Migrations: Expulsions of Populations in Europe in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century" will be shown here from the 10<sup>th</sup> of August until the 29<sup>th</sup> of October 2006 on the first floor in three exhibition galleries (approx. 600 sqm).

The *Kronprinzenpalais* is capable of providing suitable environmental conditions for exhibitions.
